Summary

Abu Dhabi Music and Art Foundation (ADMAF) signed a one-year grant agreement with, The Global Gumbo Group on January 1st, 2013. This grant agreement afforded The Global Gumbo Group the opportunity to provide for and engage with a number of young people in the UAE through various Arts and Culture initiatives devised and delivered by ADMAF.

1. 'Let's Make Art' at Dar Al Ber

Project Overview: Calligraphy Art Workshops & Exhibition

Calligraphy Art Workshops, led by renowned **Emirati Artist Abdul Aziz Al Fadli**, have been held regularly in 2013 and early 2014 for the children of **Dar Al Ber Orphanage**.

In December 2013, ADMAF and Dar Al Ber decided to select the most talented and motivated young artists from the first three workshops to complete the arts programme. The artist focused on developing their calligraphy skills and preparing for an exhibition.

The children's artworks will be exhibited in the Abu Dhabi Festival community programme called, 'The Nation Narrates,' at The Space, twofour54, Abu Dhabi on Wednesday, March 19th between 6-9pm.

The series of visual arts workshops gave practical art education to children with special needs. The aim of the project was to create an 'out of classroom environment' that could elevate the spirit and self-confidence of the students. In addition, the aim was to develop the teachers' awareness and confidence in using arts in a special needs classroom and to encourage them to build on these skills alongside other learning activities throughout the academic year.

This programme also encouraged the development of active, responsible citizens by working with Emirati and Expat volunteers in the sessions.
